The Illinois Department of Public Health

children entering a child care facility or  
preschool, kindergarten, fifth grade and  
ninth grade. The examination must be com-  
pleted within 1 year prior to entry into the  
above grades."

In addition, proof of immunizations is re-  
quired. The immunization record must in-  
clude a Hepatitis B Vaccines (3 doses), a Hib-  
vaccination, and the regular vaccines.
